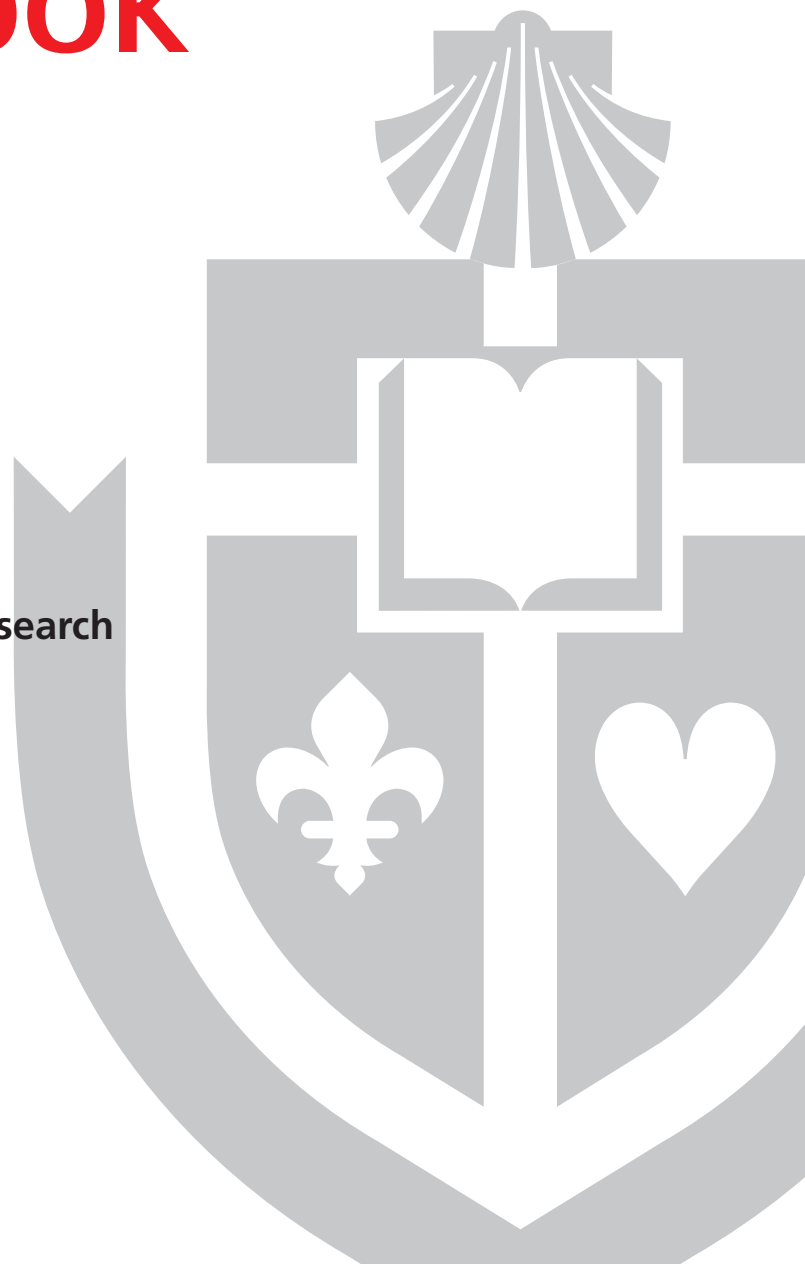

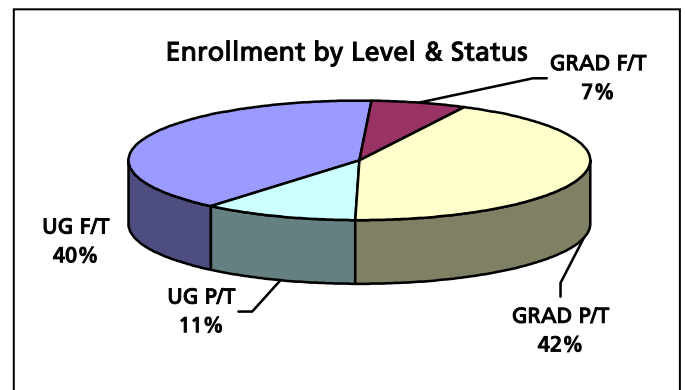


OVERVIEW

Enrollment

- Total enrollment for Fall 2005 is the largest enrollment ever for St. John's University with 20,346 students. This is an increase of 3% over the 19,813 students in Fall 2004. The full-time equivalency of 16,509 was slightly higher than the 16,330 in Fall 2004. Undergraduates increased by 2% from 14,848 to 15,092 while the number of graduate students increased 6% from 4,965 to 5,254.
- Overall, there were no significant changes in the distribution of enrollment between Fall 2003 and Fall 2004.

- Eighty-seven percent of the students are on the Queens campus.
- Seventy-nine percent of undergraduates and thirty-seven percent of graduate students are full-time students.

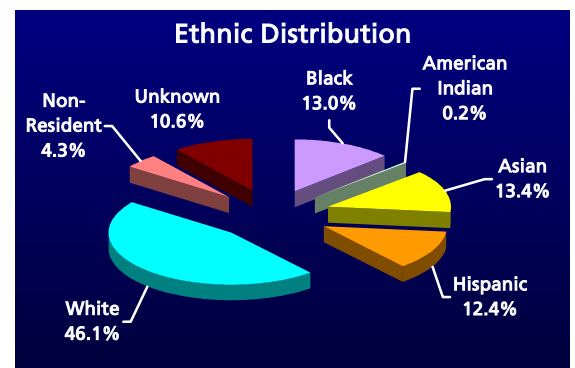
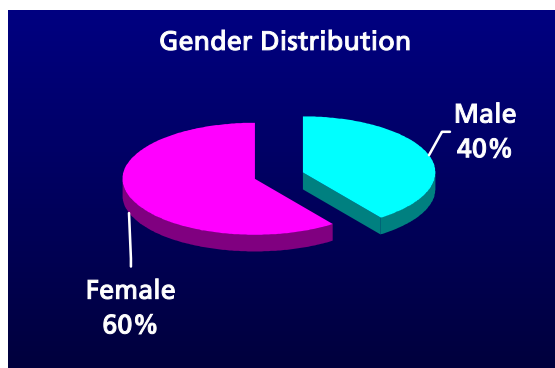


- The number of resident students increased on the Queens, Staten Island and Manhattan campuses with the addition of the off-campus units on Union Turnpike from 2,544 to 2,766.
- Enrollment includes 36 students displaced by Hurricane Katrina.
- Overall, new student enrollment increased 3% from 4,398 to 4,509.
 - The number of new freshmen increased from 3,005 to 3,159, the largest freshmen class since 1984.
 - The number of new graduate students decreased slightly from 1,393 to 1,350.
- External transfers remained stable with 572 students (compared to 565 in Fall 2004).
- Overall, the number of continuing students remained stable with 11,245 (compared to 11,248 in Fall 2005). There was a 1% decrease on the undergraduate level and a 2% increase in the number of continuing graduate students.

Demographic Characteristics

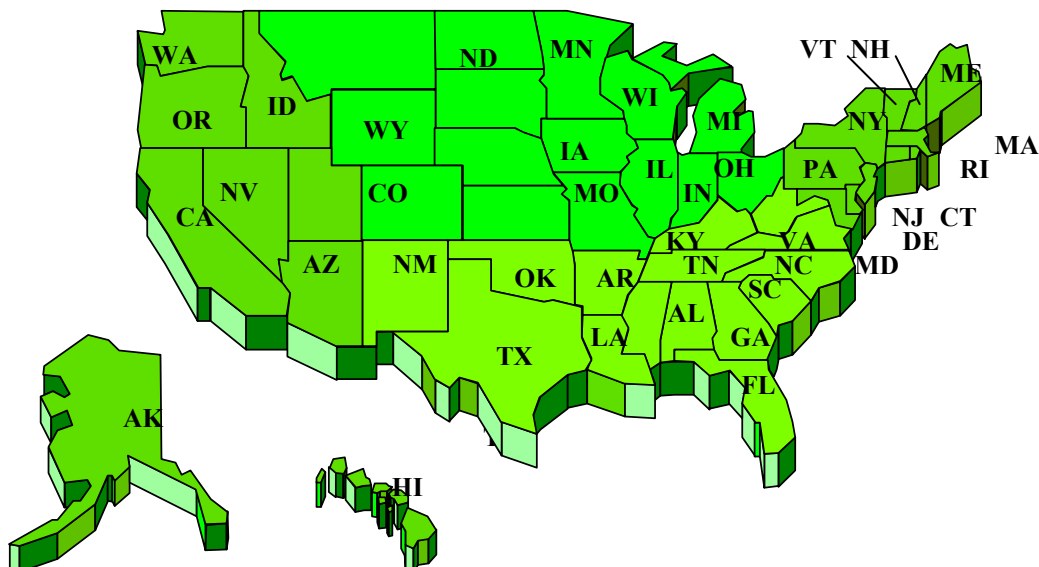
There were no significant changes in the demographic profile of the student body between Fall 2004 and Fall 2005.

- The percent of female students remained the same at 60%.
- The average age of students remained at 20 years for undergraduates and 29 years for graduate students. The average age of new undergraduate students remained at 18 years.
- Black, Hispanic, Asian/Pacific Islander, and American Indian students remained at 39% of the student population.
- Roman Catholics account for 51% of the students. This remained the same compared to Fall 2004.



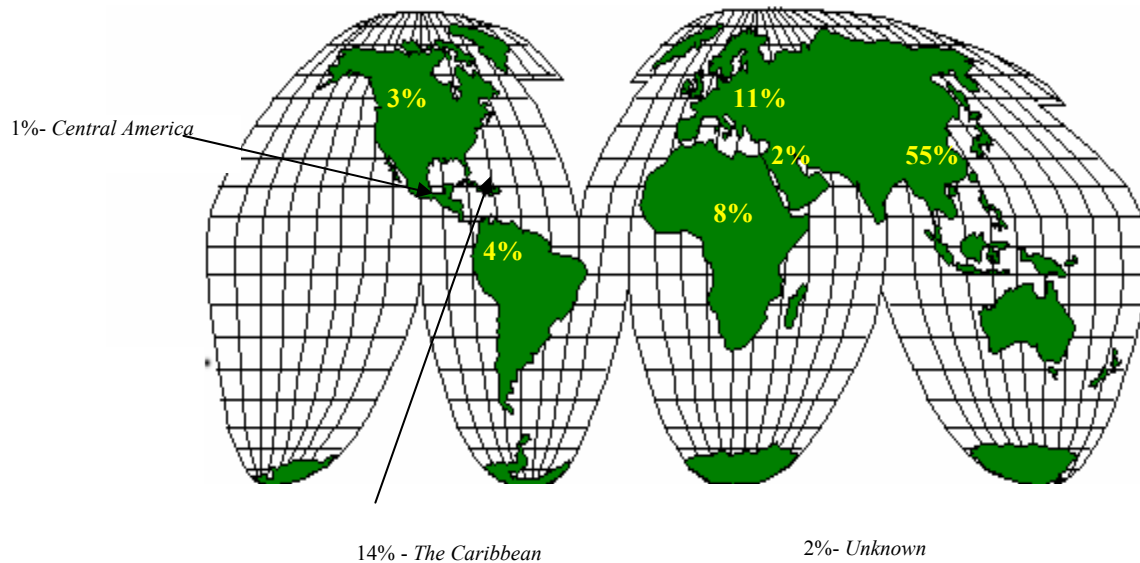
Geographical Distribution of the Student Body

- Students come from 43 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and US Virgin Islands. This is comparable to 44 states in Fall 2004 data.
- The majority of the students (59%) still come from New York City. An additional 23% come from Nassau and Suffolk Counties, New York. This is similar to that of Fall 2004 where 61% were from NYC and 22% from Nassau and Suffolk Counties.



- Non-Resident students increased by 10% from 807 to 884, representing 4% of the total student population. They account for 3% of the undergraduate population and 9% of the graduate population. This is the largest number of Non-Resident Students since 1990.
- Non-Resident students come from 103 countries compared to 97 in Fall 2004.
 - Five countries account for 52% of the students: Republic of China (Taiwan), India, Trinidad and Tobago, South Korea, and People's Republic of China.
 - Undergraduate Non-Resident students come from 96 of these countries.
 - Graduate Non-Resident students come from 57 of these countries.
- When permanent residents are factored in, 131 countries are represented in the student body.
 - Undergraduates come from 121 of these countries.
 - Graduate students come from 80 of these countries.

Fields Of Study

- Excluding unknown and high school extension program, the five most popular programs on the undergraduate level are: Pharmacy; Criminal Justice; Psychology; Communication Arts; and Biology.
- The five most popular programs on the graduate level are: Law; Pharmacy; Elementary/Childhood Education; Education Administration and Supervision; and Psychology.

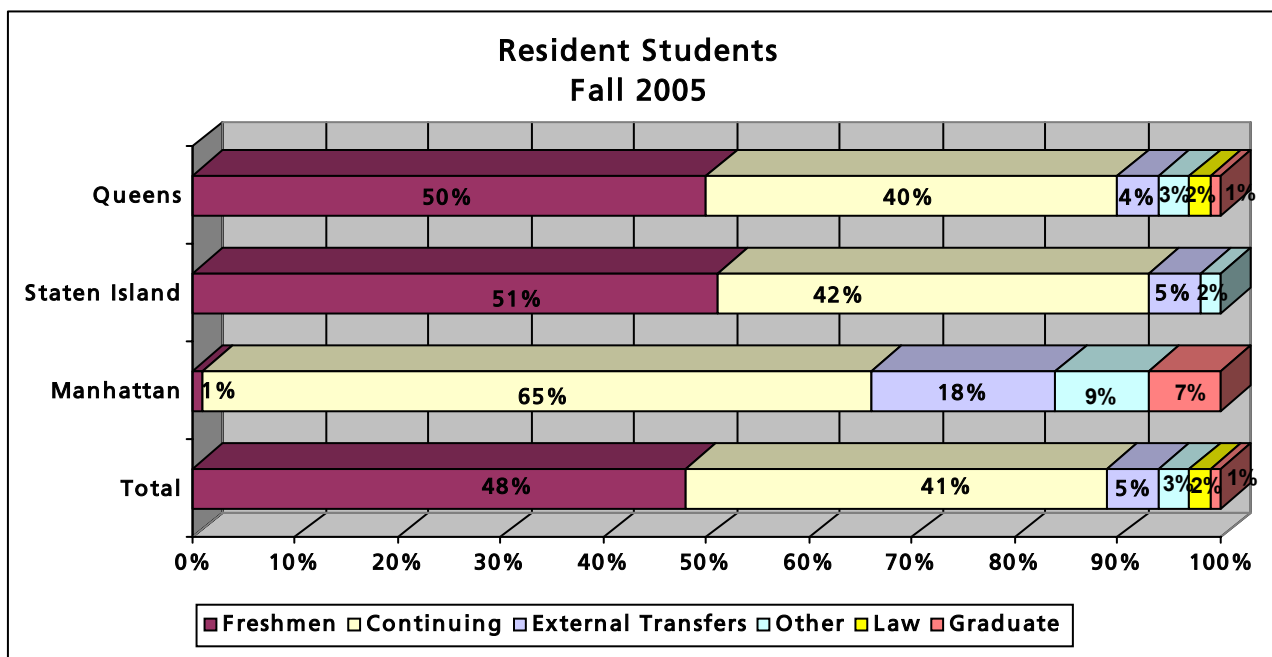

Characteristics of Resident Students

- There are a total of 2,766 resident students: 2,427 on the Queens campus; 226 on the Staten Island campus; and 113 on the Manhattan campus. Queens figures includes students living in the Garden Apartments on Union Turnpike.
- Queens campus:
 - 50% freshmen; 40% continuing students; 4% external transfers; 3% other undergraduate; 2% law; and 1% graduate
 - Students come from 39 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico & U.S. Virgin Islands.
 - Non-resident students come from 37 countries
 - 40% male and 60% female
 - 46% Black, Hispanic, Asian/Pacific Islander, or American Indian.
- Staten Island campus:
 - 51% freshmen; 42% continuing students; 5% external transfers; and 2% other undergraduate
 - Students come from 14 states
 - 30% male and 70% female
 - 42% Black, Hispanic, Asian/Pacific Islander, or American Indian.
- Manhattan campus:
 - 65% continuing students; 1% freshmen; 18% external transfers; 9% other undergraduate; and 7% graduate
 - Students come from 17 states and Puerto Rico
 - 37% male and 63% female
 - 37% Black, Hispanic, Asian/Pacific Islander, or American Indian.
- Overall, 42% of the total Fall 2005 freshmen class reside in residence facilities. This is compared to 39% of the Fall 2004 freshmen class.



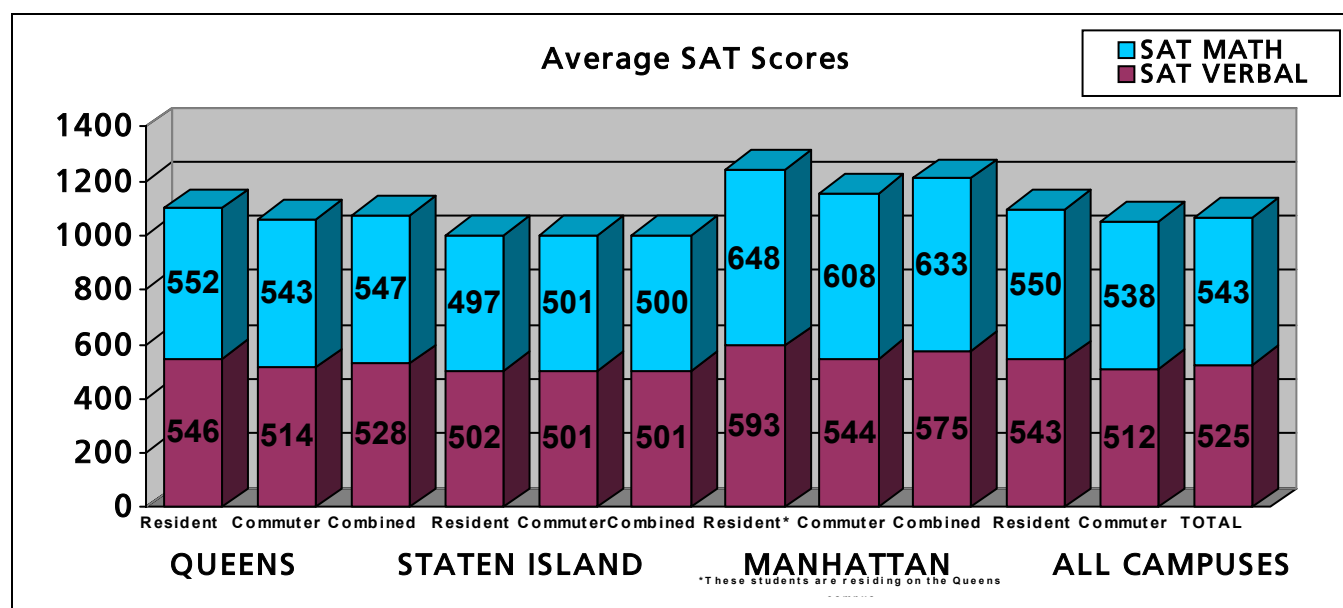
Characteristics of Incoming Students

Retention and Graduation Rates for Undergraduate Students

- Seventy-nine percent of full-time baccalaureate students who were freshmen in Fall 2004 returned to the University in Fall 2005. This is similar to the 78% for the Fall 2003 freshmen class.
- The changes in rates for each ethnic group were:

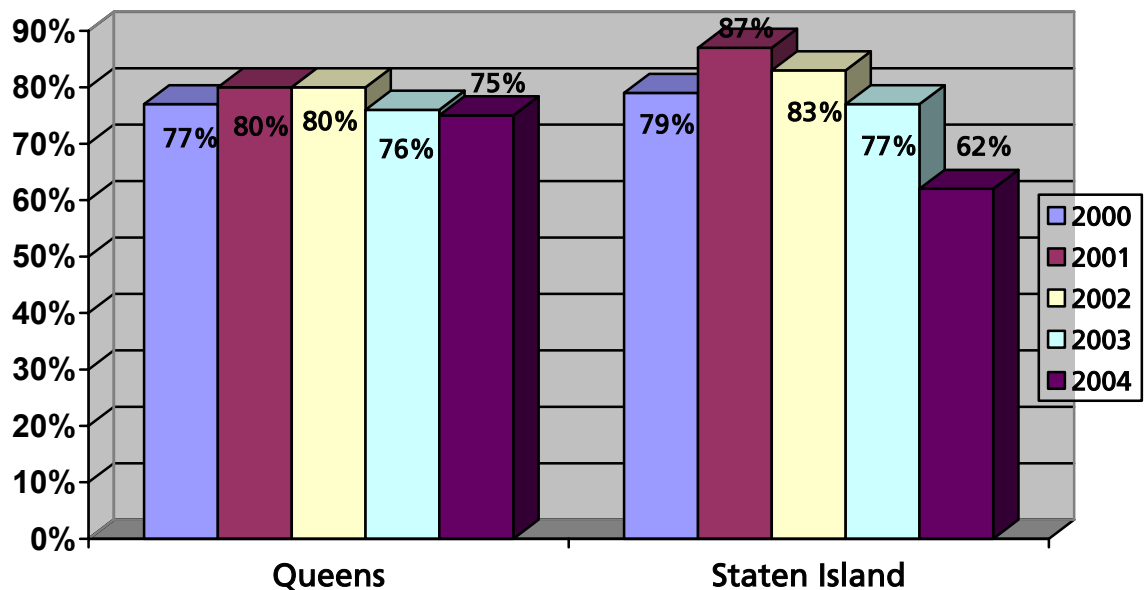

- For females, the retention rate increased from 78% for the Fall 2003 freshmen class to 81% for the Fall 2004 freshmen class. The retention rate for males went from 78% for the Fall 2003 freshmen class to 77% for the Fall 2004 freshmen class.

Retention Rates for Resident Students

- Queens campus:
 - Seventy-five percent of the freshmen living in the residence halls in Fall 2004 returned in Fall 2005 to the University, while 55% returned to live in residence facilities. This is compared to 76% and 60% respectively for the Fall 2003 freshmen class.
- Staten Island campus:
 - Sixty-two percent of the freshmen resident students in the Fall of 2004 returned to the University in Fall 2005, while 40% returned to live in residence facilities campus. This is compared to 77% and 69% respectively for the Fall 2003 freshmen class.

Includes students who return to the residence halls and those who did not

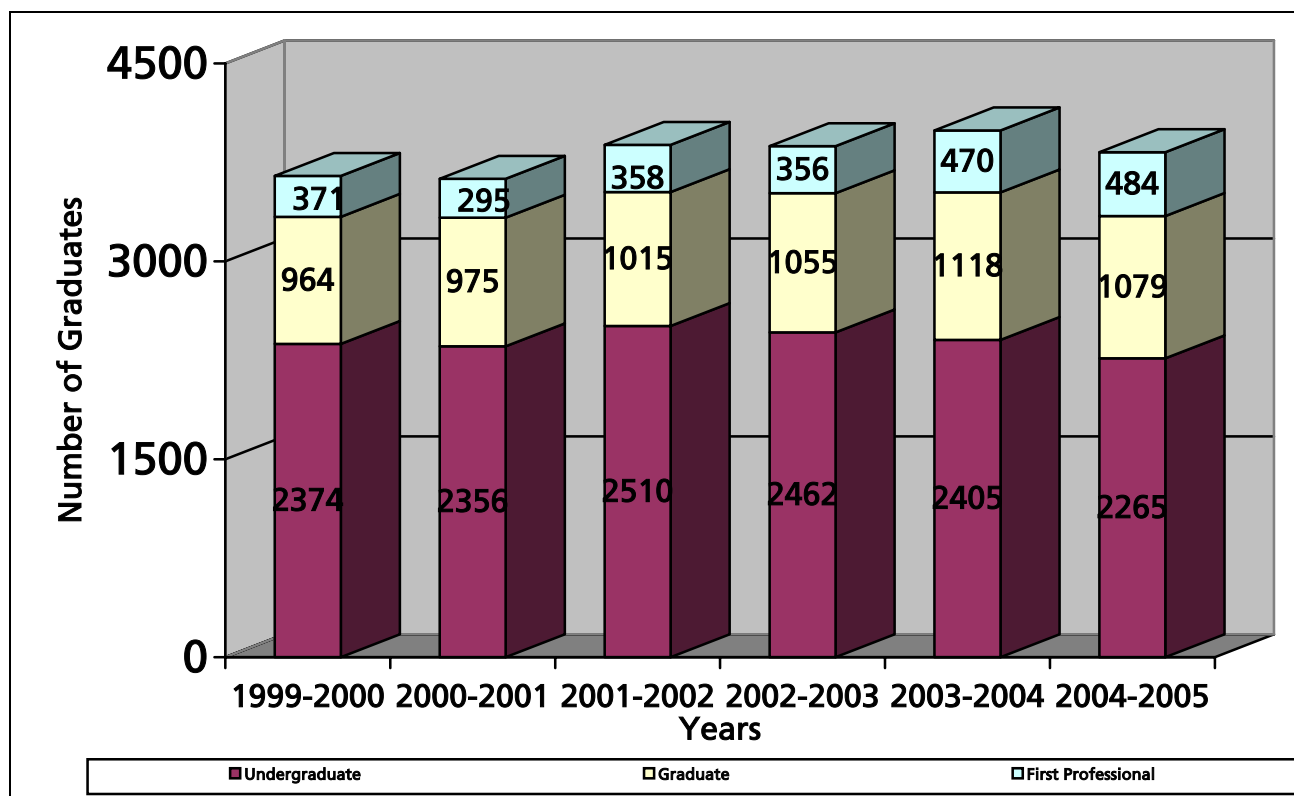
Retention and Graduation Rates for Graduate Students

- Eighty-one percent of first-time graduate students (including law students) in the Fall of 2004 returned to the University in Fall 2005. This is similar to 80% who started in Fall 2003 and returned in Fall 2004.
- Based on the Fall 1998 cohort, 79% of first-time graduate students graduated within 7 years.

Degrees Conferred

- St. John's University conferred 3,828 degrees in the 2004-2005 academic year compared to 3,994 in 2003-2004. Degrees were awarded at the associate, baccalaureate, master, doctoral, law and other first professional level. Postmaster's diplomas and certificates were also awarded.
- Fifty-seven percent of the graduates were baccalaureates. Twenty-five percent were master's; and eight percent were law graduates.
- Sixty-one doctoral degrees were conferred compared to 53 in 2003-2004 with more than half of them being conferred in St. John's College.
- Thirty-five percent of our graduates were Black, Hispanic, American Indian, or Hispanic.

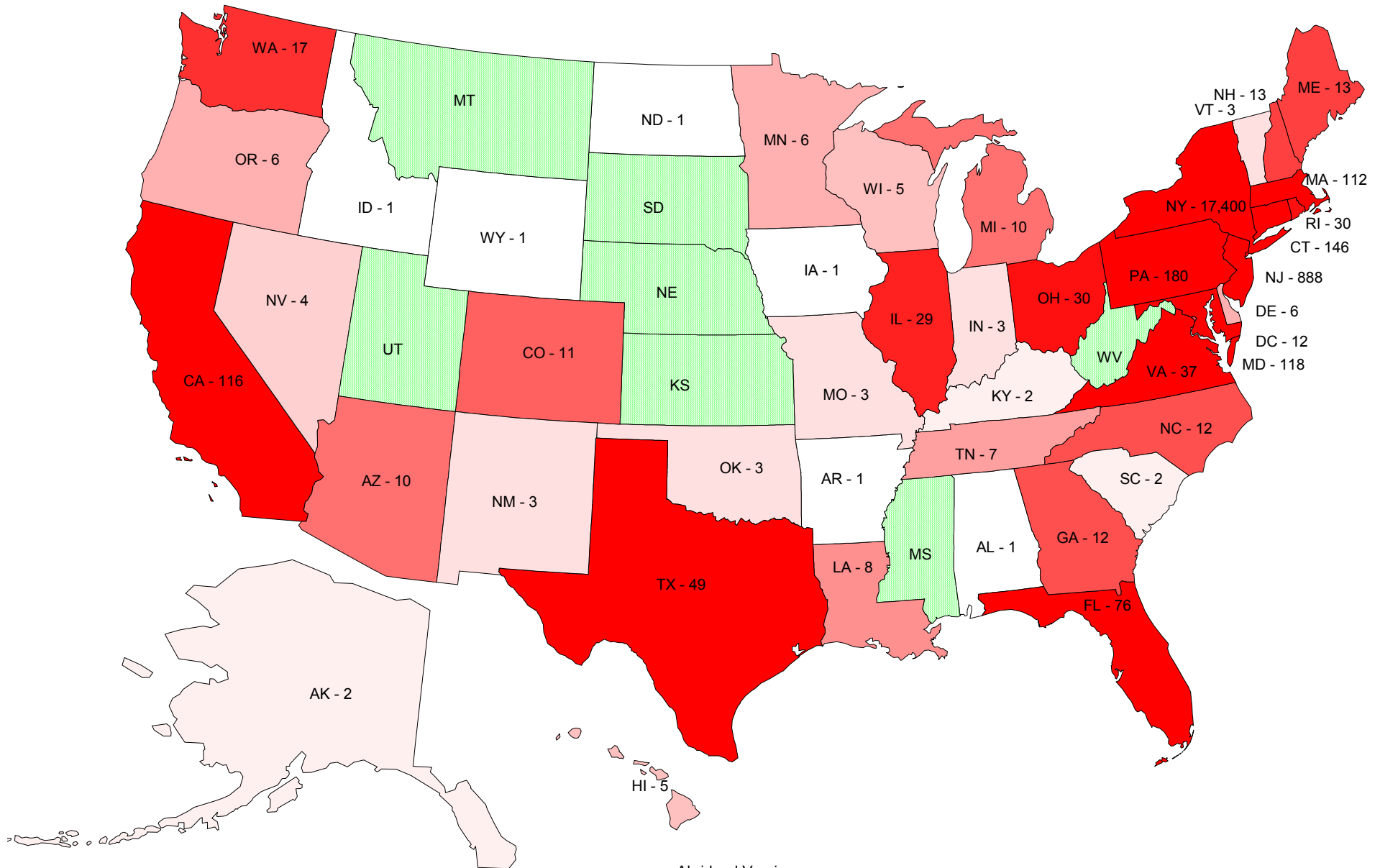

- *The majority of the students (59%) still come from New York City. An additional 23% come from Nassau County and Suffolk Counties, New York. This is similar to that of Fall 2004 where 61% were from NYC and 22% from Nassau and Suffolk Counties.*
 - ◆ *60% of the undergraduates come from New York City. An additional 25% come from other areas of New York State.*
 - ◆ *55% of the graduate students come from New York City. An additional 30% from other areas of New York State.*
- *Students come from 43 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and US Virgin Islands. Ten percent of the student body comes from states outside of New York. This is comparable to 44 states and 9% in Fall 2004.*
 - ◆ *Undergraduates come from 40 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and US Virgin Islands. Eleven percent of undergraduates come from states outside of New York which is similar to the 10% in Fall 2004.*
 - ◆ *Graduate students come from 32 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico. Six percent of graduate students come from states outside of New York. This is similar to the 29 states and 5% in Fall 2004.*
- *There are 884 Non-Resident(International) students that represent 4% of the total student population. This is the largest number of Non-Resident Students since 1990.*

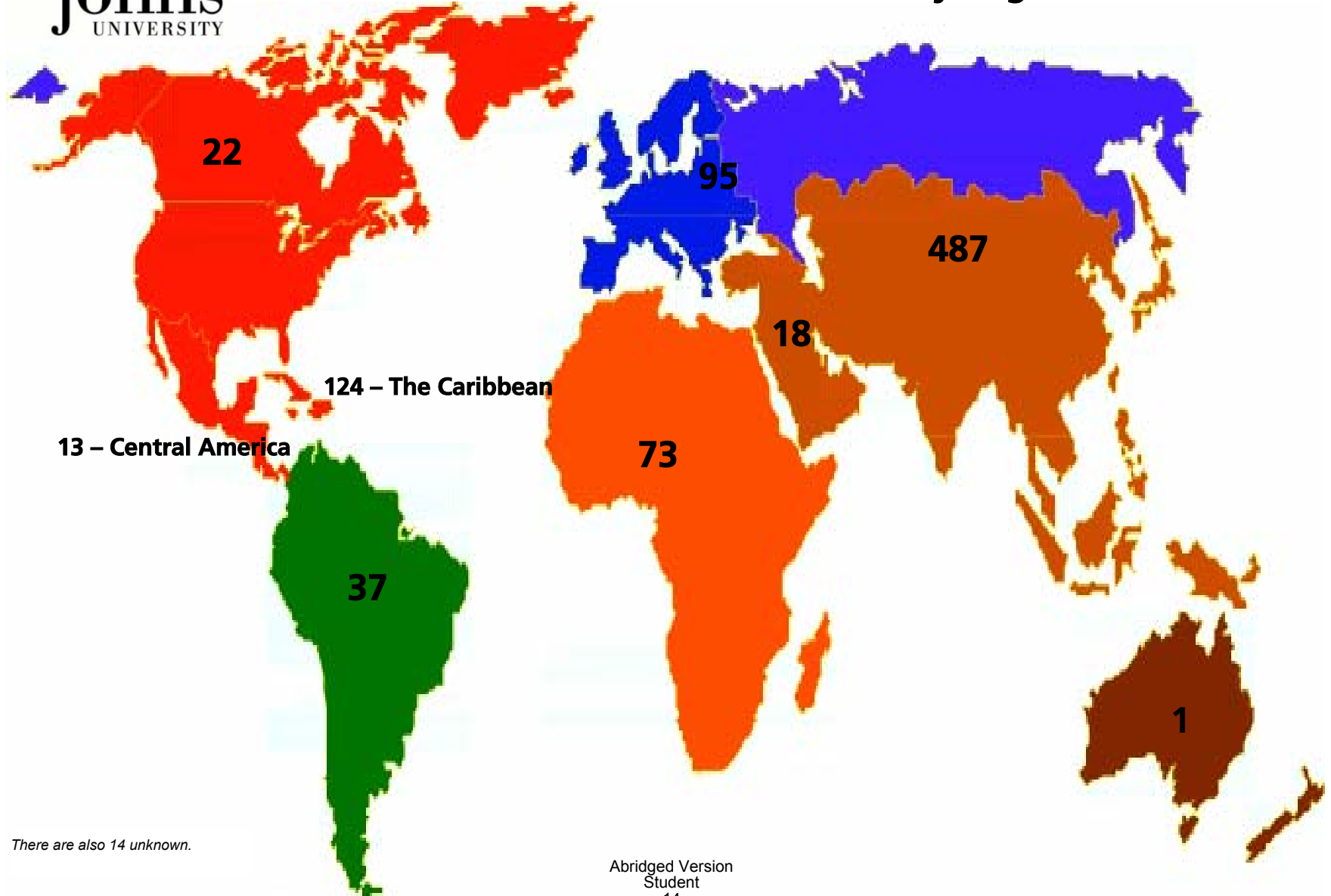
St. John's University Geographic Distribution of Students by State Fall 2005

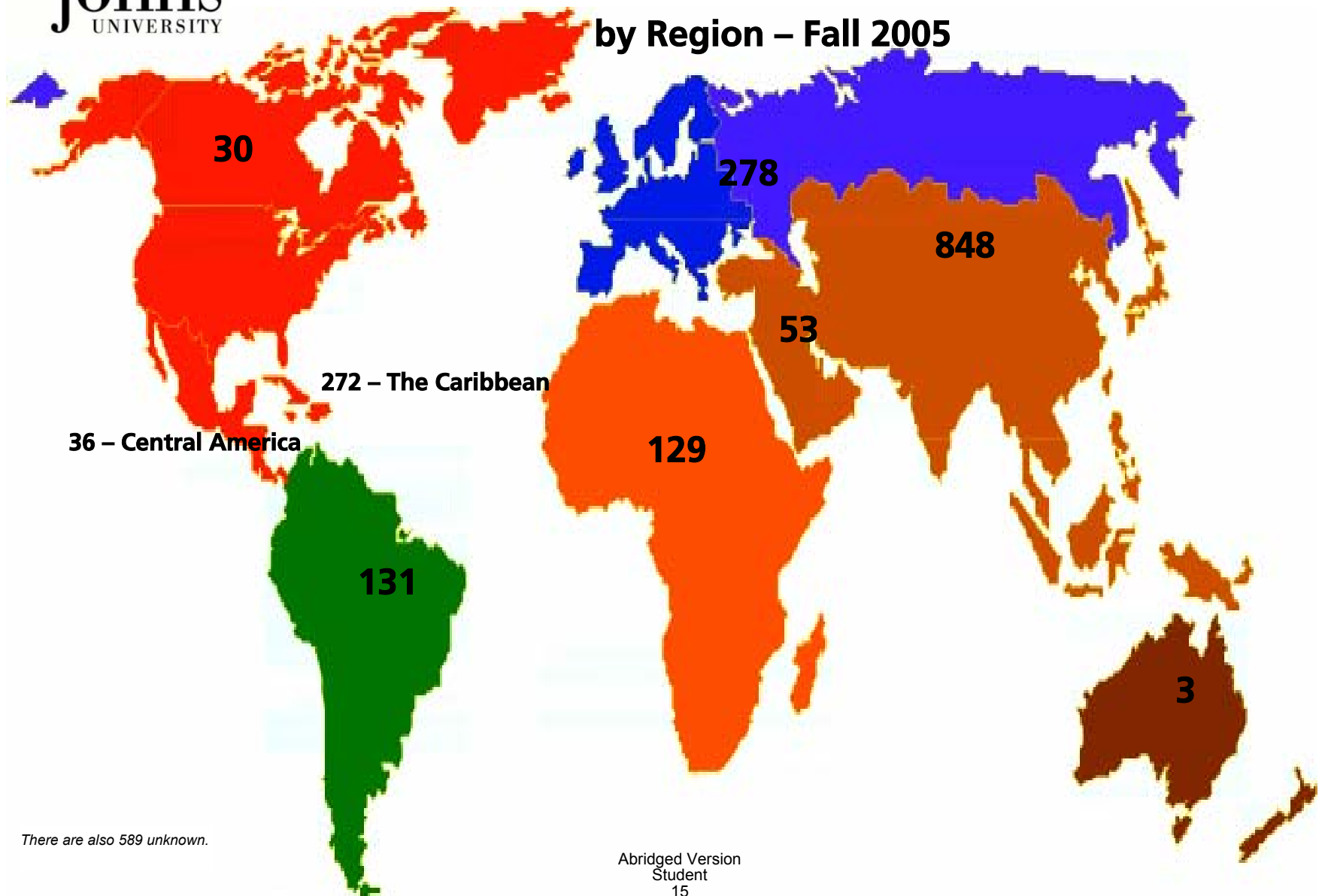

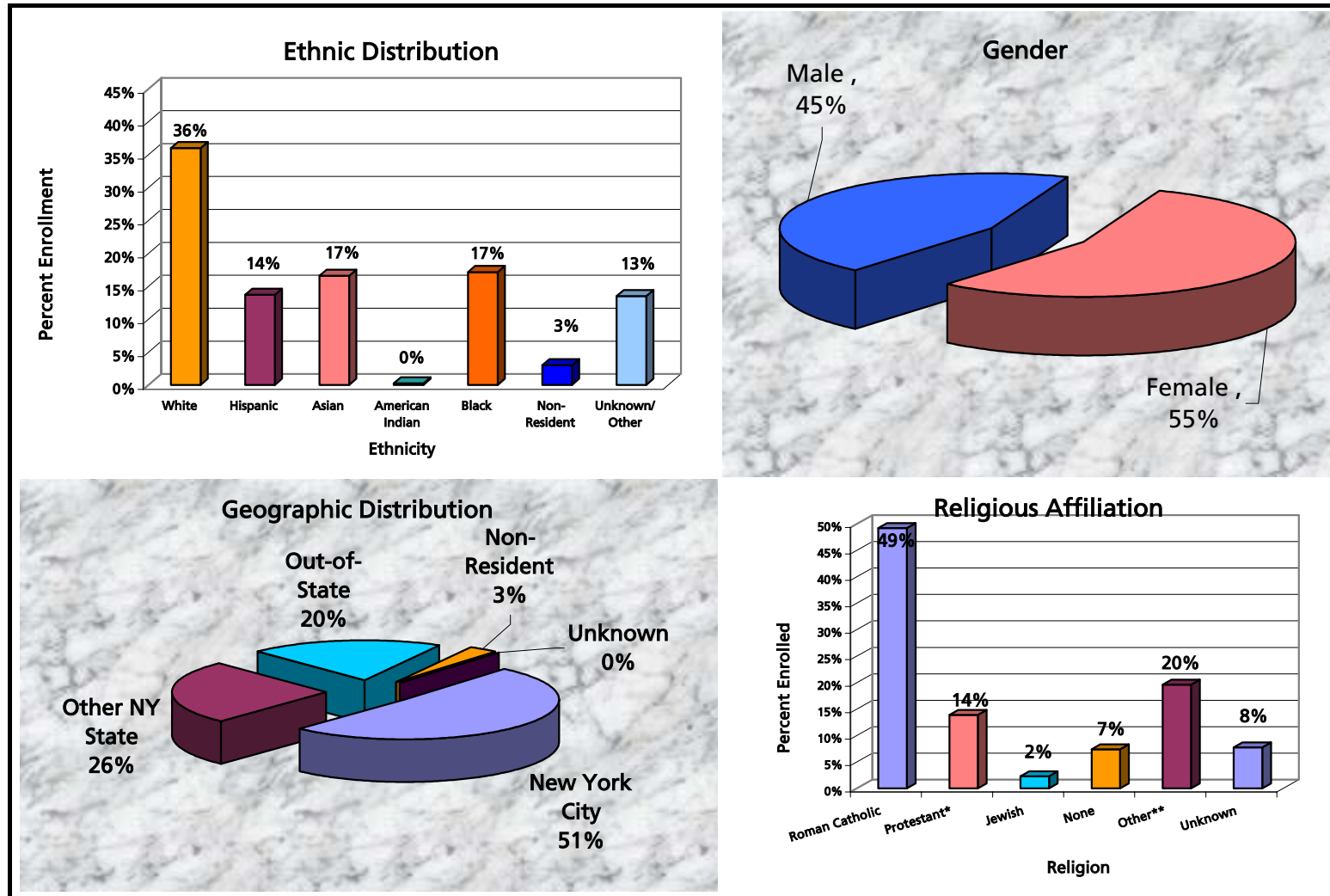

Fall 2005 Freshmen

- *There are 3,159 new freshmen (2,726 – Queens, 389 – Staten Island and 44- Manhattan). This is the largest class since Fall 1984.*
- *55 % are female and 45% are male. 48% are Black, Asian/Pacific Islander, Hispanic, or American Indian.*
- *49% are Roman Catholic.*

Demographic Characteristics of Freshmen Fall 2005

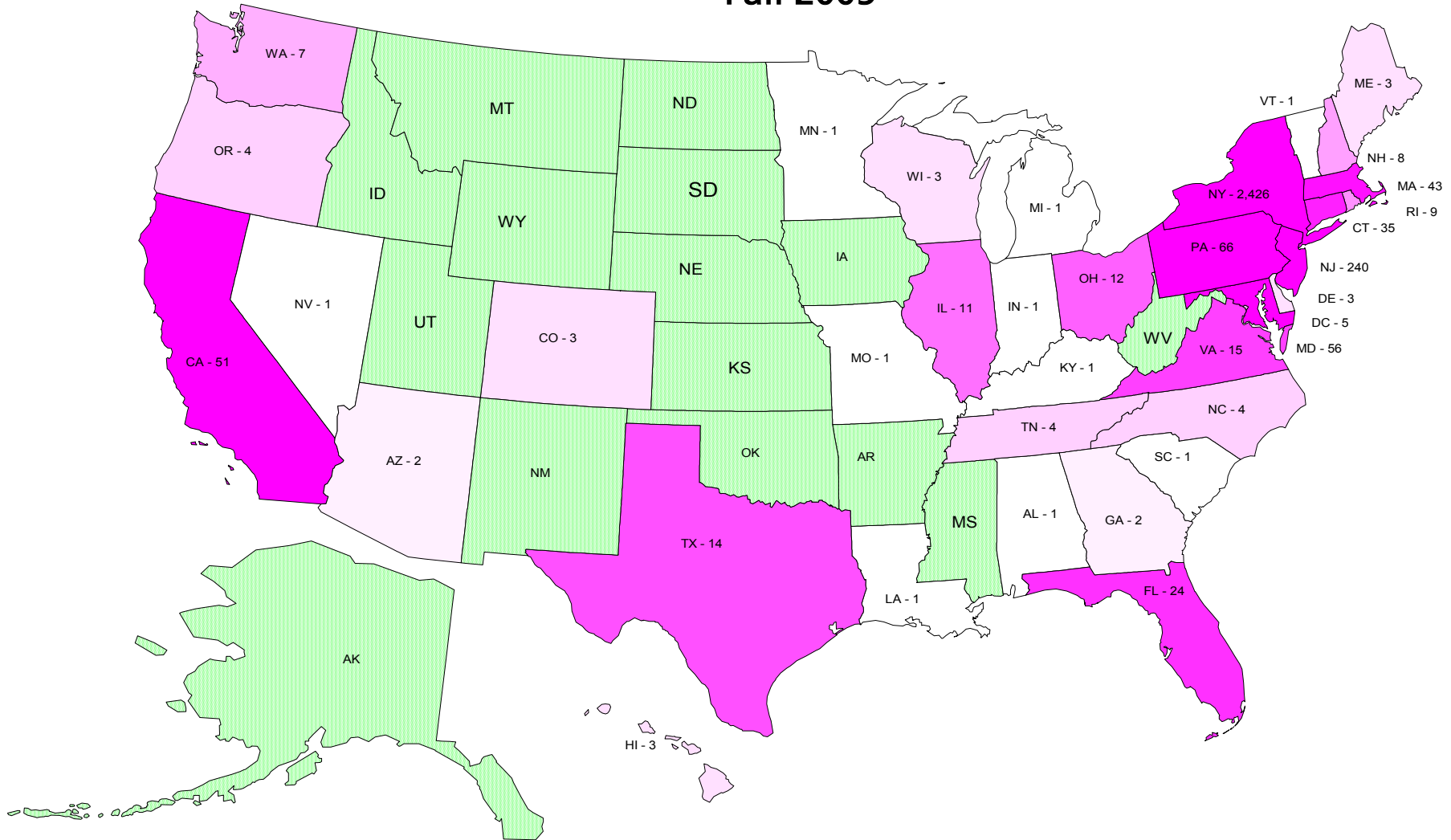

University

- Total inquiries have almost doubled in the past five years, from 62,935 in 2000 to 111,023 in 2005.
- Among private universities in New York State, St. John's has the third largest number of applicants behind New York University and Cornell University.
- New freshmen applications continued to increase, approximately doubling since 2000, exceeding 20,000 in 2005.
- The acceptance rate continues to decline, reflecting our increasing selectivity. In 2005, the acceptance rate is 63% and in 2000 it was 85%.

Queens Campus

- Total inquiries, applications, and acceptances were at all time highs.
- The enrollment rate decreased from 36% in 2000 to 24% in 2005.

Staten Island Campus

- Applications increased 58% from 1,375 in 2000 to 2,170 in 2005.
- The acceptance rate decreased from 82% in 2000 to 64% in 2005.

Manhattan Campus

- Number of inquiries increased from 855 in 2004 to 1,427 in 2005.

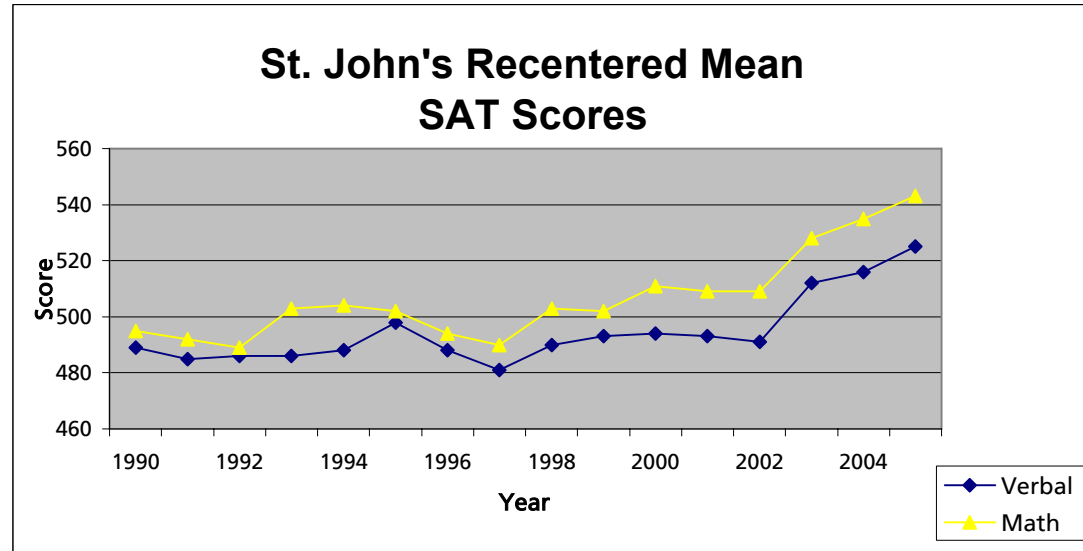

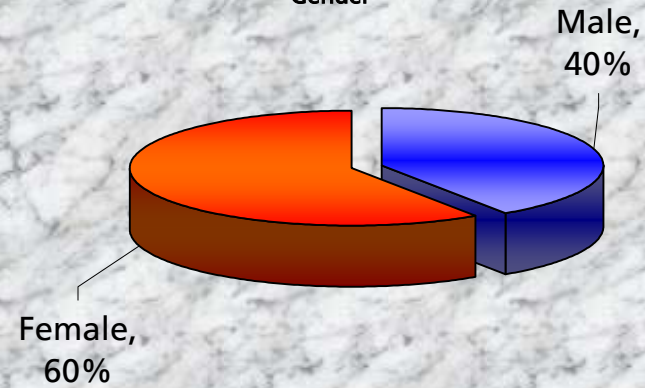

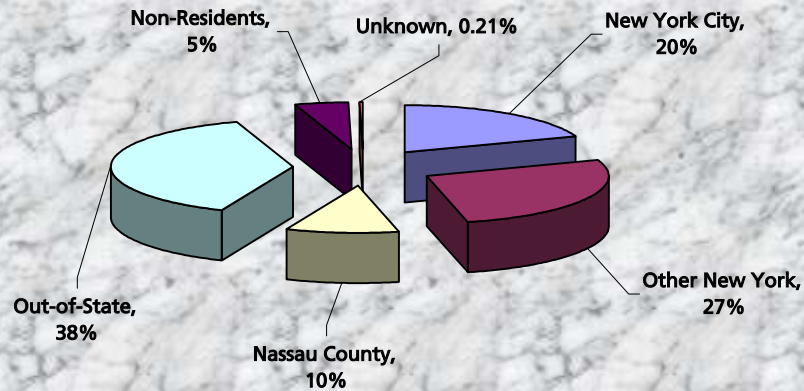
Ethnic Distribution



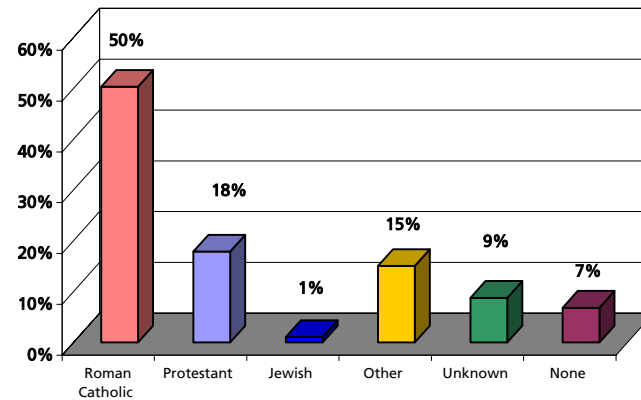

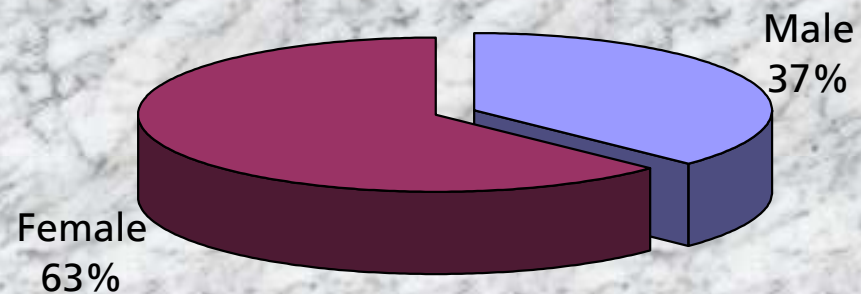


Demographic Characteristics of All Resident Students - Manhattan Campus Fall 2005

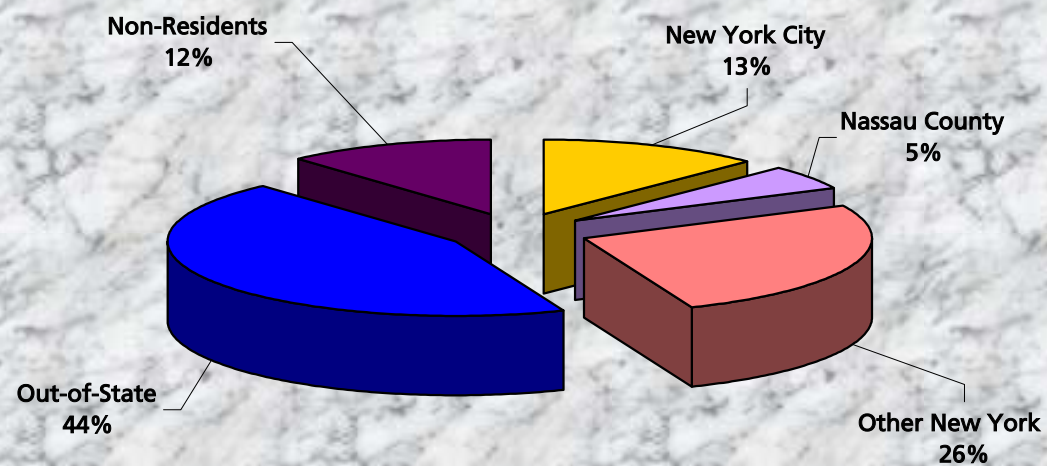
Ethnic Distribution



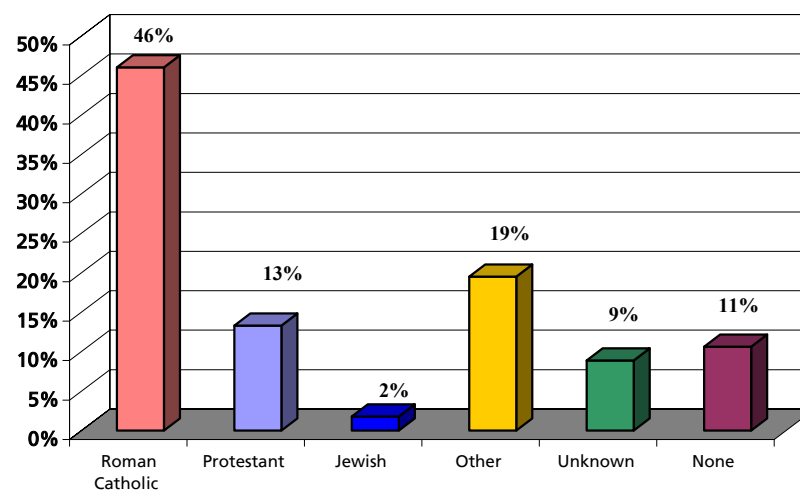

2004-2005 Degrees Conferred

- *There were 3,828 degrees conferred in the 2004-2005 academic year. This is compared to 3,994 in 2003-2004. Degrees were awarded at the associate, baccalaureate, master, doctoral, law, and other first professional level. Post master's diplomas and certificates were also awarded.*
- *Fifty-seven percent of the graduates were baccalaureates. This is the same as in 2003-2004.*
- *Twenty-five percent were master's compared to 26% in 2003-2004.*
- *Eight percent were law graduates compared to 7% in 2003-2004.*
- *Sixty-one doctoral degrees were conferred with more than half of them being conferred in St. John's College of Liberal Arts and Sciences.*
- *Sixty percent of our graduates were female compared to 59% in 2003-2004.*
- *Thirty-five percent of our graduates were Black, Hispanic, American Indian, and Asian compared to 34% in 2003-2004.*

Retention and Graduation Rates

Undergraduate

- Seventy-nine percent of full-time baccalaureate students who were freshmen in Fall 2004 returned to the University in Fall 2005. This is similar to the 78% for the Fall 2003 freshmen class.
- The changes in rates for each ethnic group were:

- For females, the retention rate increased from 78% for the Fall 2003 freshmen class to 81% for the Fall 2004 freshmen class. The retention rate for males went from 78% for the Fall 2003 freshmen class to 77% for the Fall 2004 freshmen class.
- For the freshmen class of 1999, 65% graduated within six years compared to 66% of the class of 1998.

Graduate

- Eighty-one percent of first-time graduate students (including law students) in the Fall of 2004 returned to the University in Fall 2005. This is similar to 80% who started in Fall 2003 and returned in Fall 2004.
- Based on the Fall 1998 cohort, 79% of first-time graduate students graduated within 7 years.

Retention, Graduation, and Continuation Rates Fall 1990-Fall 2004

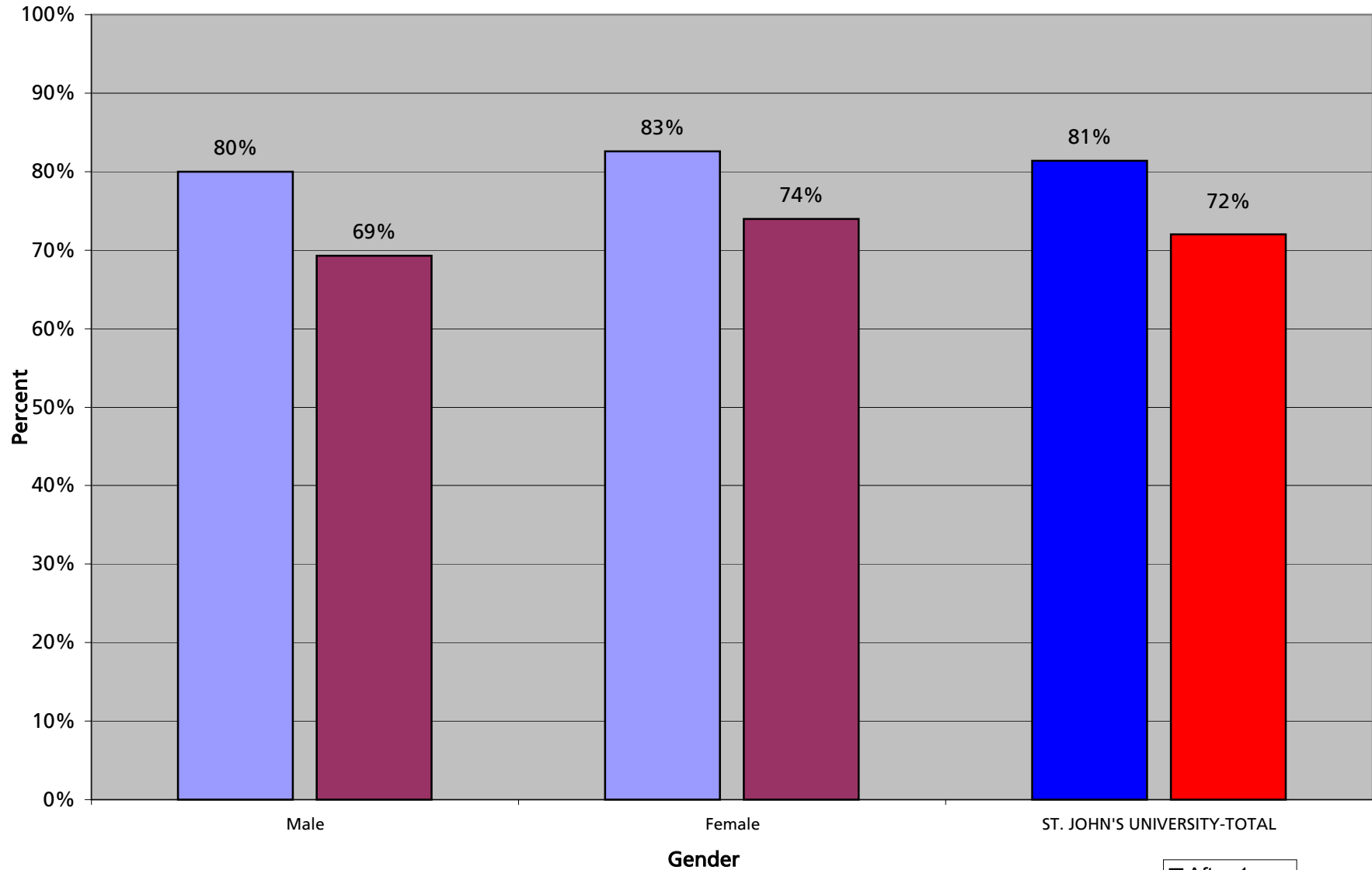

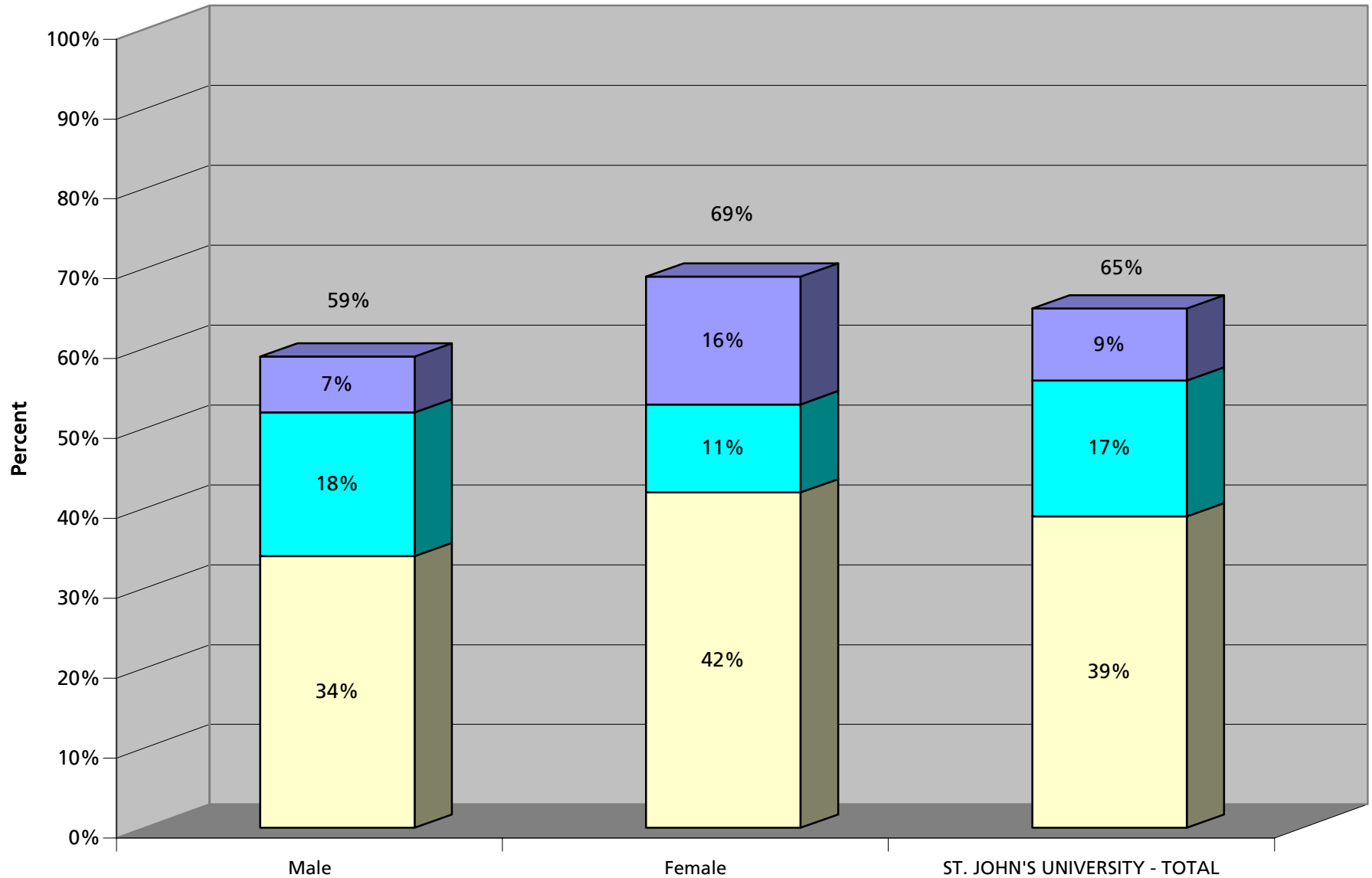

1997 - 2001

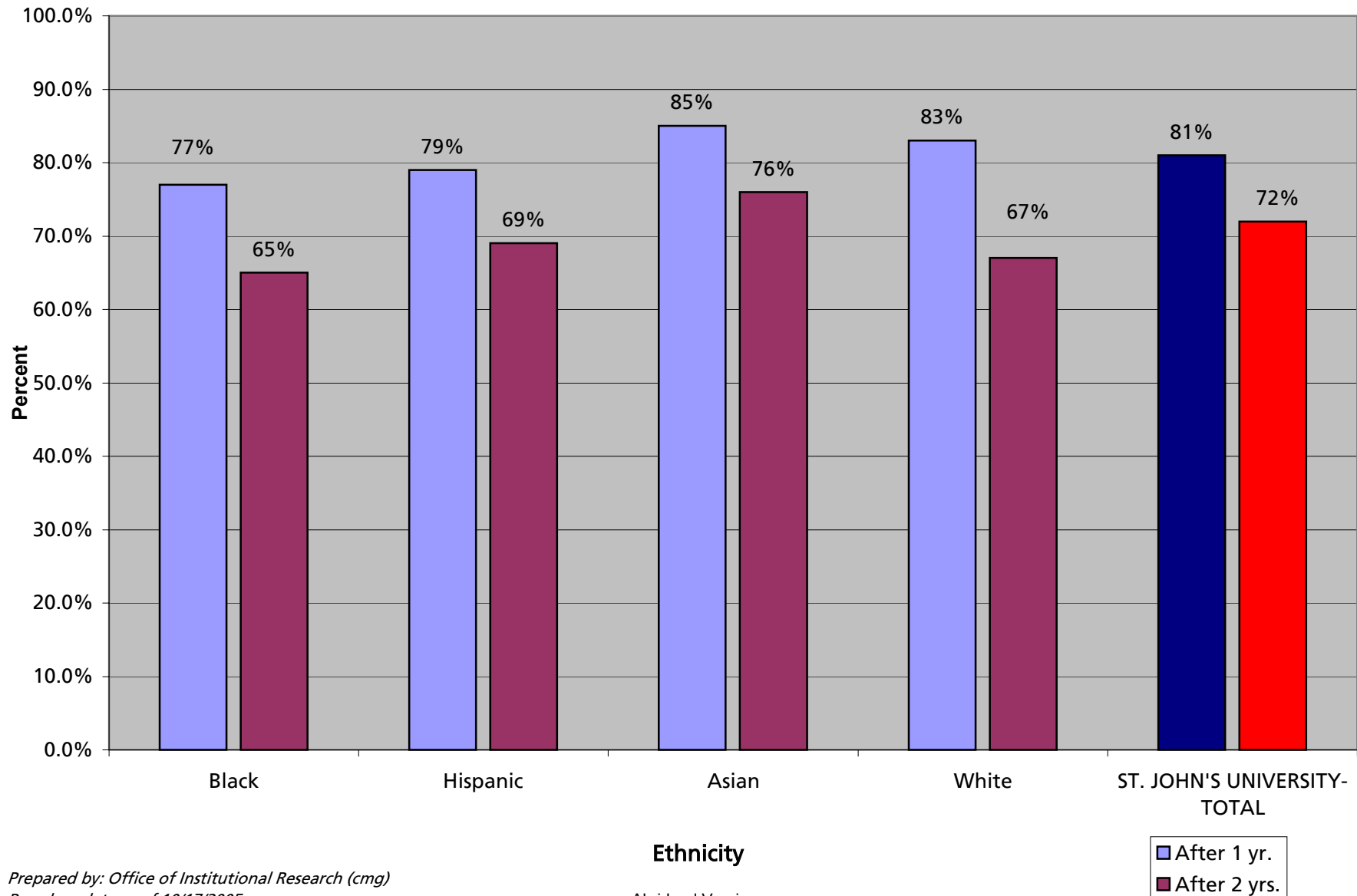

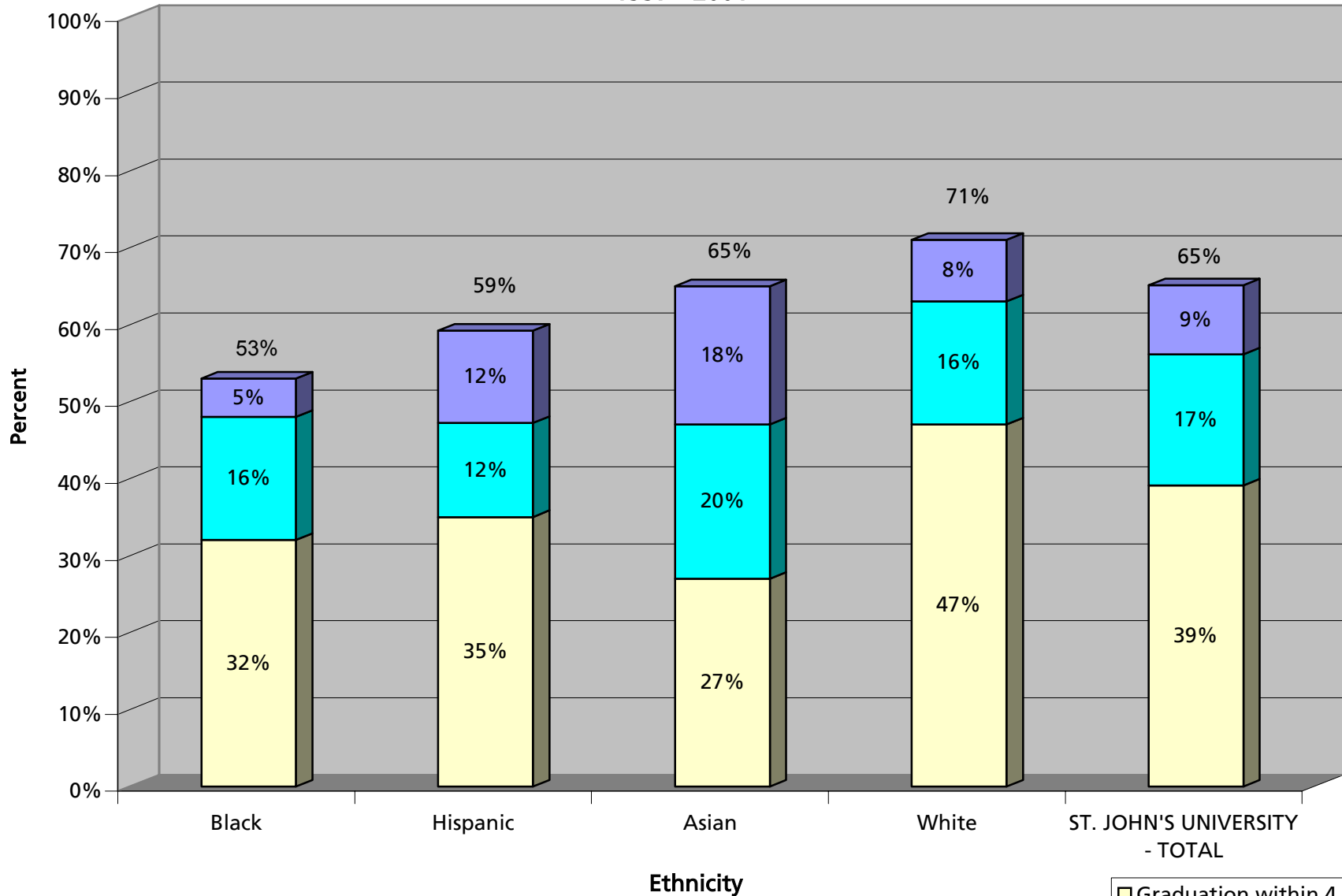
Composite Retention Rates
