Leonard M. Baynes, *Professor of Law; Director, Ronald H. Brown Center for Civil Rights and Economic Development*



On February 22, Professor Baynes was a featured speaker at the Fourth Annual Queens Forecast Breakfast, which was sponsored by the Queens Economic Development Council. The breakfast also featured United States Congresswoman Nydia Velazquez and Brian McMahon, the president of the New York State Economic Development Council. Professor Baynes presented the findings of [The Q-626 Report](#), his study of the largest majority- and minority-owned businesses in Queens. Professor Baynes' findings were subsequently reported in feature articles in the *Queens Tribune* and the *Times Ledger* papers.

In other activities, Professor Baynes participated in an ABA site visit at Georgia State University School of Law; published an essay titled *Celebrating Martin Luther King's Birthday, Black History Month, and the Media* on the NPR Justice Talking Blog, introduced Dr. Randall Pinkett, one of the "apprentices" from the Donald Trump show at reception at St. John's University where Dr. Pinkett talked about his book *Campus CEO*; and was selected by the Rockwood Leadership Program for a Fellowship in Media,

Communications and Information Policy. The Rockwood Fellowship funds training programs designed to foster “a stronger and more democratic media.”

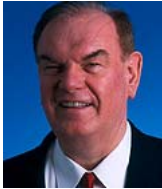
David L. Gregory, Dorothy Day Professor of Law
